Saeler Named New Strasburg Principal

A former Central High School assistant principal has moved north to take the helm at Strasburg High School.

Morgan Saeler, 37, started his new job Monday after the Shenandoah County School Board appointed him to the position on July 16.

Saeler has worked for Shenandoah County Public Schools for 14 years. He taught social studies at Peter Muhlenberg Middle School before serving as an assistant principal at all three county high schools, including at SHS from 2007 to 2009.

Unlike his previous jobs, Saeler said being a principal will require him to have more of a big-picture idea of the school's direction.

"Being an assistant principal, you tend to be focused on the little things," he said. "As

a principal it's important to have an overall vision of how you want to operate and be

able to juggle all the other things."

Saeler said he wants to continue SHS' goal of mak-

ing students globally competitive, and that he has started by asking school personnel and community members what they think the school needs.

"We're looking to build on the success we've had here," he said. "What does Strasburg High School need to be successful and competitive?"
