The house at left has long since been removed. Until the 1960s it was the site of C&R Chevrolet, later Grubbs Chevrolet. More recently it has been the location of a branch bank. The building in the center and on the south side of High Street has been removed. Until recently it was the site of a gas station and now is the location of M&R Mart, a convenience store. July 19, 1888

7/3/103

Abraham Funkhouser was born Jan 8, 1800 and died July 13, 1888, aged 88 years 6 months and 5 days. He was the father of 11 children, six of whom are living.

Mary, aged about 27 years, wife of Walter Jefferson, colored, at her home in New Market Friday, and was buried at the Lewis Bird graveyard, several miles east of New Mar-

ket. Mr. I. Hite Bird is tearing away the old house on the corner in front of his elegant new dwelling, preparatory to arranging a large yard that surrounds the house. When Banks' army entered Woodstock on the morning of April 1st, 1862, Mr. Jno. S. Hoshour, then a mere boy, hid a revolver under the eaves of this old dwelling house, then occupied by his father's family. Strange to say, he never thought of the weapon until a few days ago when he saw them tearing away the building. He went upstairs, reached under the eaves and drew out the pistol that had quietly reposed there during all the remaining years of the war and up to the present time. It was but slightly rusted and showed plainly the maker's name and factory in Glasgow, Scotland.

July 26, 1888

Died. Daniel Kagey, son of William H. and Martha J. Lloyd, July 20, aged one year.

Near Cabin Hill July 27, Mr. Jacob Wolfe, aged 84 years 4 months and 20 days. He leaves a wife and five children to lament their sad loss, five of his children having preceded him to the grave.

Jackson Company in the 33rd Virginia Regiment, Stonewall Brigade, and was badly wounded at the first battle of Manassas. His age was about 46 years and he leaves a wife and seven children.
