March 23, 1893

Died. March 17 at the residence of her son, Mr. Adam Storks near Forestville, Mrs. Catharina Storks, aged about 76 years. She was born in Germany and emigrated to this country about the year 1847.

Beulah Estella, daughter of Benj. E. and Mollie Fravel March 6th, aged one year.

Anna Myrtle, daughter of J. W. Fravel, Harrisville March 18, aged nine years.

Mrs. Susan Rodeffer at the home of her son-in-law in Woodstock, Mr. John Brooks, on Friday, aged 75 years.

Mr. Wayman Lichliter of near Maurertown of heart disease on Tuesday of last week, aged 65. His remains were interred in a private burying ground upon the farm of Mr. John Bowman near Zion's church.

From news received by letter, we learn that Mr. John Sine, son of George Sine of Hawkinstown, was killed by the breaking of a chain while endeavoring to straighten a large tree on the streets of Red Bluff, California. He was born in Columbia Furnace, moved to Newark, Ohio about 24 years ago, and then to Iowa and then to California. His age was 44 years. He married about a year ago and leaves a widow.
