## Strasburg rallies for win over Cards

FRONT ROYAL — A play at home plate capped off a furious rally for Strasburg

on Friday night.

Stroop said of the last play.

We messed up twice earlier
in the game, but that time it
was all the way and kudos
to [Kaleiwahea] for sticking
with that throw."

"I think you got to send him right there — you do," Front Royal manager Brad Neffendorf said. "... That's not what this game comes down to. We left too many guys on base. We had opportunities to score and we didn't get a couple things done when we needed to."

Trailing 4-1 in the top of the eighth, the Express scored three runs to tie the

game.

Daniel Midyett and Trevor Rucker drew back-to-back walks and Drew Johnson hit an RBI double to cut the lead to 4-2.
