May 29, 1890

June 5, 1890

Cucumber Bugs - A Remedy. To destroy cucumber bugs, take 15 cents worth of calomel and mix it with a pint of flour and sprinkle it over the stalks or hills, by means of a very fine sieve, gauze or otherwise.

Died. At her residence near Twyman's Miller, Madison County, Virginia May 26, Margaret Strother, wife of Fielding Strother aged 62 years. "Aunt Margaret" as familiarly called, lived in New Market a number of years in the service of Col. N. I. Henkel.
