Dec. 26, 1895 4/28/05 Died. Mr. Noah Swartz of Saumsville Thursday night. NOTICE. Notice is hereby

given that on the 16th day of December 1895 for violation of Internal Revenue Law, I seized near Fishers Hill Va. Five packages of Apple Brandy and two apple stills. Any persons claiming said property is hereby notified to appear at my office in Front Royal, Va., within thirty days after the first publication of this notice and establish their claim to same. M.M. Johnson, Deputy Collector, 2d Div. 6th Dis. Va.

Same as above, at St. Luke seven packages of apple brandy and two copper still and caps...

Same as above, at Alonzaville seven packages of apple brandy and one copper still and cap...

Same as above, at Fisher's Hill, eight packets of apple brandy and two caps...

Same as above, at Zepp, two packets of brandy and one copper still and cap...

Same as above, at St. Luke, four packages of apple brandy and two copper stills and one cap...

Same as above, at Headquarters, one package of apple brandy and two copper

stills and caps... Edinburg. A very destructive fire broke out in Mr. E. M. Clem's store on last Saturday morning at 2 o'clock and burned to the ground the following buildings on Main street: Mr. Charles Ruby's dwelling; E. M. Clem's store, under which was the Edinburg Sentinel newspaper office, owned by E. L. Hisey, the residences of R. W. Burke, J. J. Stoneburner, G.J. Zimmerman, Mrs. Julia Wightman and Hotel Murray. On Piccadilly Street, Painter & Reeser's livery stable, Murray's livery stable and the shoemaker shop of R. H. R. Stoneburner. The loss has been estimated at \$35,000. By cutting down the barber shop of C. W. Jennings, the lower end of town was saved.
