### School meals

Shenandoah County Public Schools has announced its policy for providing free or reduced-price meals for children as part of the National School Lunch and/or School Breakfast programs.

Household size and income will be used to determine eligibility for free or reduced-price meal benefits. The program benefits:

 Children who are members of households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly the Food Stamp Program) or who receive Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).

 Children who are homeless, migrant or runaway.

• Foster children, who are the legal responsibility of a welfare agency or court.

 Children who are members of households participating in WIC.

Application forms along with income guidelines and information about the program are being distributed to all households. Applications are also available at the principal's office in each school.
