Jan. 8, 1879

December 23rd in Powell's Fort, Elizabeth Habron, daughter of James Habron and his wife Elizabeth, at the age of 13 years. Just before dying she said to her brother, "Goodbye, Ben. Now in a few minutes I'll be dead." Thus she calmly passed away. Her parents, four sisters and five brothers remain to cherish her memory.

December 30, Mr. Ronald Donaldson, aged 72. He was born in Baltimore. In 1837 he came to this county.

Near Hamburg Dec. 17 Mrs. Mary Fry, aged 60 years. She leaves a husband and eight children.

Near Mt. Zion Church, Mrs. Nicholas (Mary Catherine) Kipps, aged 54 years.

Jan. 15, 1879

Died. Mrs. Rebecca Elizabeth Sidney Moore was born on the 23d day of May 1841, and died December 19, 1878, aged 37 years, six months and 26 days.

At Columbia Furnace, January 5, Daisey Day, aged three months.

At Edinburg January 9th, Edward Miller, aged 20 years, 8 months and 5 days.

Jan. 22, 1879

Death of an old citizen. Mr. P. F. Everly of Strasburg died last Thursday. He was a drummer boy in the War of 1812.

On the 30th of December in Woodstock Robert P. Gaw, aged 69 years. Mason Orndorff died in the jail in Woodstock last Wednesday morning. His mind became impaired about three years ago and not being able to get into the lunatic asylum, he was compelled to remain in jail until death released him.

Feb. 5, 1879

Died. Mrs. Barbara Elick of Woodstock was paralysed last Thursday evening about 9 o'clock and died at 11 o'clock, aged about 71 years.

Mr. Christian Summey died at his residence near Saumsville last Sunday morning at the advanced age of 94 years. Mr. Summey came with his son from Pennsylvania a few years after the war.

On January 27, Angus J. Coffman, near Jacob's Church, aged 16 years.

Nora Emma, infant daughter of J. B. and Mary M. Hess, Quicksburg, aged eight months.

In Powell's Fort on January 30th of diphtheria, Opha Alice, daughter of Joseph A. and Rachel P. Keller, aged one year.

Near Mt. Jackson on the 19th of January, A. L. Pattie in the 41th year of his age. He leaves a wife and three children.

The Canadian horse known as Jim, belonging to Mr. Philip Olinger, who resides near Quicksburg, died on the 13th inst., having attained the remarkable age of 28 years, 4 months and 15 days. Old Jim has been a faithful worker in the wagon and cart since the year 1853.
