BOOKKEEPING AND ELEMENTARY ACCOUNTING

Seven and One-half Hours Weekly—Three Terms

Covers:

Bookkeeping in relation to management; principles of journalizing; posting; classification of accounts; inventories; statements; trial balance; partnership accounting; corporation accounting. The analysis of accounts and the preparation of comparative statements to determine profitable and unprofitable lines, unnecessary losses and leaks and rate of turnover on different lines of merchandise.

Laboratory Work:

Practical problems and complete bookkeeping sets in the theory department supplemented by office practice.

ADVANCED ACCOUNTING

Three and Three-quarter Hours Weekly—One Term

Covers:

Various accounting systems; accruals; depreciation rates; property records; bad debts; reserve accounts of bad debts and depreciation; ratios; cost accounting systems. This is followed by an intensive study of the balance sheet, in which every account appearing among the assets is considered as to the methods of evaluation, methods of showing on the balance sheet, etc. Many problems are required; some done in class, some at home and some as demonstration problems.



TYPEWRITING

Three and Three-quarter Hours Weekly—Three Terms

Covers:

Correct fingering (Touch System); the development of accuracy and speed; copying of legal and business forms; the preparation of various kinds of business reports and statements; preparation of stencils for mimeograph work; artistic arrangement of work on paper.
